Funding Formula and Accountability Plan



A four-hour workshop on the LCFF and LCAP for school districts and charter schools, with detailed instructions on the minimum proportionality percentage (MPP) and how Ed-Data can help give educators and all interested parties easy access to comprehensive data about K-12 education in California.

- Discussion of the factors that affect the LCFF calculation, and the sources of those factors.
- How to read the results of the LCFF Calculator, including key charts and graphs for improved communication to stakeholders.
- Details of how to calculate the MPP in the LCFF Calculator and make the connection between funding and services in the LCAP.
- Generating a locally meaningful LCAP and long-term planning process.
- Discussion of key areas in which departments need to work together to succeed.
- Understanding the LCAP approval process.
- Latest information available for the LCAP evaluation rubric.
- Other LCFF and LCAP topics of current interest.
